

The Instrumental Tuition Scheme

In addition to the benefits of expressive arts education within the Curriculum for Excellence and NQ courses, you may apply for your son or daughter to receive specialist tuition on an instrument.

Tuition will be limited to one instrument per pupil.

The advantages of the scheme include:

- Small group tuition each week.
- A guaranteed place in an ensemble, band, orchestra or choir.
- Regular opportunities to perform in public.
- Informal concerts and workshops.
- A teaching environment, which sets a high value on music.
- Preparation for the grade examinations of the Associated Board of the Royal Schools of Music and similar external awarding bodies.
- Help and encouragement from a wide range of council staff.
- An instrument loan scheme.
- An annual written appraisal of your child's performance, progress and prospects with his or her instrument.

A number of places are available on the Instrumental Music Tuition Scheme. However, instruments are a scarce resource and there may not always be enough council instruments available to supply the demand.

Many retailers offer generous rental or leasing schemes, which allow payments you make to count towards the final purchase price of the instrument.

Fees for 2020/21 tuition are £524.00 per year (which may be paid by Direct Debit in 10 instalments of £52.40).

Concessionary rates of £117.50 (which may be paid by Direct Debit in 10 instalments of £11.75) are available for those families in receipt of Housing Benefit/Income Support/Universal Credits (Standard Allowance or Housing Element). For those families who are in receipt of Free School Meals you are eligible for free music tuition.

The fee guarantees a minimum of 30 lessons across the year. For anyone entering the scheme later during the academic year, fees and number of instalments will be adjusted according to the amount of lessons still available.



How does my child get a place on the Instrumental Music Tuition Scheme?

1. Complete the application form on Page 2 and send it to:
Music Development, Education Services, Clackmannanshire Council, Kilncraigs, Alloa, Clackmannanshire FK10 1EB
2. For most instruments there is a waiting list. When we are in a position to progress, we will make arrangements for an Instrumental Tutor to contact your child at school in order to carry out an evaluation regarding your child's suitability to the instrument requested.
3. We will let you know if Clackmannanshire Council can provide you with an instrument or not.
4. If a Clackmannanshire Council instrument is not available, you may wish to rent or lease an instrument from a retailer. The Music Development Officer and the Instrumental Tutors can offer advice and information regarding these arrangements.
5. Your child will then be formally offered tuition and you will need to complete the forms enclosed with the "Instrumental Music Tuition Scheme" guidelines, which explains in detail how the scheme works.
6. Your child will be allocated a teaching time and you will be contacted with the final arrangements for their first lesson.

What is expected of my child?

The scheme is designed to provide an opportunity for any child who has the enthusiasm to work hard to learn an instrument. The only expectations we have of pupils are:

- To attend lessons and practise regularly
- To show a reasonable aptitude for the instrument
- To join one or more of the available ensembles
- To represent their school and the council by performing in public.
